

Red Bin Recycling

In the Bin

Scrap Paper

includes unwanted mail, envelopes, fax paper, greeting cards, paper egg cartons, paper tubes, and cereal boxes. Remove paper clips, staples are okay. Place into a brown paper bag and place it into the bin. Please secure the material to prevent it from blowing out. **Do not include tissue paper, paper towels, or paper coated with food, wax, foil, or plastic.**



Milk Cartons & Drink Boxes

Remove any plastic (handles, spouts etc.), rinse clean, drip dry, and place into the bin. **Do not include the plastic straw that comes with drink boxes.**



Aerosol Cans

Completely empty the can through normal use, remove and discard the plastic cap, and toss the can into the bin. For safety do not flatten the can, puncture the can, or remove the nozzle.



Beside the Bin

Glass Bottles and Jars:

Remove the lid, rinse the container clean, and place into a paper bag or use your own container (a paper bag, a small bucket, or box no larger than a grocery bag). Save up and completely fill your container,

then place next to your red bins. Do not include window glass, mirrors, cookware, or **drinking glasses. Do not include any broken glass items.**



Motor Oil

Pour used motor oil into a "see-through," unbreakable container with a screw top lid (one-gallon preferred). Place next to your red bins.



Plastic Bottles and Milk Jugs

Plastic bottles have a neck that is smaller than the base. Remove and discard the lid, rinse the container clean, and toss into the bin. **Do not include plastic bottles that have come into contact with motor oil, pesticide, or herbicide.**



Metal Cans

(including aluminum and tin/steel food cans). Remove the paper label (recycle paper labels with scrap paper), rinse the can clean, and toss it into the bin.



Newspapers & magazines

just place in the bin.

Scrap Metal

Scrap metal includes foil, bolts, hangers, and other all-metal objects. Place any metal which is smaller than 36 inches long and less than 40 lbs into the bin. **Do not include metal that is contaminated with plastic, food, or other non-metal materials.**



Corrugated cardboard

Flatten boxes and place into the bin. For large boxes, flatten and place under the bin – stack no larger than 3' x 3' wide. Bundling cardboard with string prevents it from blowing into your neighbor's yard. Do not include wax-coated cardboard.
